5.1. General Comments from City Council

Mandi Villarreal Salvo

"OK bear with me if I take a little longer tonight. So, nine days on November 27th is our shop small Saturday throughout all of Hutto, along with our downtown tree lighting. So, it's a vital importance that our city does everything we can to promote our small businesses and our local economy, so I'm really excited about this event coming up and all that we're doing as a city to promote the event and I look forward to seeing the community out there shop small on the 27th and at the tree lighting. Thank you to The Studio for my hair care for poofy hair, it's very nice – to all of our downtown businesses for feeding me and to Bless this Nest for keeping my pocketbook empty. Alright, so looking forward to also joining our community at the Santa Claus Crawl and that's coming up December 4th. It's gonna be a lot of fun that night so if you had a lucky chance to get a ticket, I look forward to seeing you there. I want to invite everybody to join us at the Holidays in Hutto Festival at the Brushy Creek Amphitheater, or excuse me, The Brushy Creek at Amphitheater at Adam Morgan Park. It's gonna be a really great event and that's on December 11th. And then if you haven't yet, please swing by City Hall anytime during our open hours to look at our Women Air Service Patrol exhibit, they're here until December 3rd, and it's on loan to us from the museum. It's a really great exhibit and we have a lot of staff that are very knowledgeable about the exhibit itself. Thank you Hutto ISD for hosting another great Hippo Nation University, it's been an awesome experience we're participating in. I hope that we can do something similar on the City side one day. It's very educational, a lot of resources that I'm learning for the edification of partnerships between us and the ISD, so, if you have a chance public to apply for that program in the future, I strongly suggest it. Mr. Mayor, I'd like to see an executive agenda item before the end of the calendar year for us to discuss our relationship with our city attorneys and their working relationship with our city staff. Finally, I want to strongly encourage my colleagues-- to those

that are on the Council Protocol Subcommittee, to please make it a priority to meet as soon as possible. It seems to be that there's a lot of issues occurring with us internally that's preventing us from doing our best work for the city that can simply be alleviated by some process and protocols, and as of now, some councilmembers seem to have a more important voice than others. We need to remember our role as a policymaking arm of government, not judicial or executive. Too often, over the past months, that line has been crossed and I've made the mistake not saying anything and that ends tonight. We are legislative body and that's what we took an oath to do-- and that's all I have to say. So, thank you."

Peter Gordon

"Mayor, I've got just two items. One is, I was going to ask for us to be put on the agenda a discussion about the protocols, we had originally talked about doing it outside of this meeting, but I think scheduling it will kind of force the issue and make us get it done-- unless we want to schedule maybe 6:00 PM, something early or something like that. And then the other item that I had was --I attended a roundtable today hosted by the Central Texas Water Coalition; that's a volunteer-driven, nonprofit organization, dedicated to protecting the water supply of Central Texas. I learned a lot about the water supply or the lack thereof in central TX and the people that were there were actually very interested and very impressed with the work that we're doing in Hutto, as it relates to our aquifer storage and recovery system. They expressed a lot of interest in that and a lot of other local elected officials from the region kind of talk to me about that. They said they were really curious about how we were doing it and kind of what we're doing in Hutto to make things work --so, it seems like we're doing the right thing here."

Krystal Kinsey

"I know we don't have another meeting before Thanksgiving, so, Happy Thanksgiving to all of Hutto and just as a reminder the Hutto Resource Center is still collecting canned goods and you can donate those to the library and in lieu of fines or for someone else you can pay it forward for their library fines as well. I did have an -- it's not really my idea--it actually came from the D&I --was doing-- possibly how we did spotlights on councilmembers to doing spotlights on boards and commissions because that's really something that's important to me, is getting the people involved in filling those positions on our boards and commissions. And, how do we get people involved-- and a lot of times we find that, oh I didn't know that existed or well, how do I get involved ---so that might be something interesting for --I don't know what that causes city to film and have the videographer do those spotlights but that would be something that I personally would like to see, if possible and also for the agenda that would be really pressing for I believe it's the December 2nd meeting. We are trying to put together a booth at the Hutto Holidays --Holidays in Hutto and we want to have a booth and we're going to try and have all of the different chairs, not just the chairs with all the different boards, have a presence and maybe take shifts --so we're going to put a booth together the only reason why I want to agenda item is Councilmember Villarreal Salvo has volunteered to make the literature and the flyer for that it's kind of an all-encompassing of here's our boards here's the commissions kind of just a small blurb so just the printing costs that that would incur is really what I I want to see and of course that's up for discussion and if we don't want to do that we don't want to do that but I feel like it would really we really need to start shifting back to our boards and commissions and just overall I've been hearing a lot from our boards and commissions that they necessarily don't feel like they're getting a lot of traction or a whole lot of attention so I want it I want to right that. And, I know that it's come up in several previous meetings and I didn't know if we can get an update on that making City Hall, especially, accessible to all-- so just want to see some follow up on that. What do we need, what would it cost would it to get where we need it to be to be accessible. I definitely agree we need to have those council protocols. I personally would be moving to have a

parliamentarian, which may be another volunteer from one of our residents --that would be amazing. You can get certified to be a Parliamentarian and I think that that can really aid the city in acting in a more having more decorum I think would really help the city overall. Nobody-- I don't think any of us on here are official parliamentarians, so, I think that having that as a Hutto resident really might be a good idea. It is in my opinion that what city council's purpose is starting to become --it's starting to become blurred and we are overreaching our capacities council members we are the legislative body, not the judicial and we're not the HR of city staff. On a community post, a resident who's in the room, Mr. Jim Weaver, pointed out that we are elected to represent how to at large not just our own pocket of supporters I challenge every member of this body to ask themselves how does this help Hutto as a whole, how does this benefit Hutto as a whole. What will this cost Hutto and is it worth that cost. Think about those questions when we're posting on social media and when we are bringing up agenda items. We all have equal importance and we all have the ability to right this ship and I think that that's something that we really need to bring into focus, so, thank you Mr. Jim Weaver for your post on that. I enjoyed reading your comments."

Robin Sutton

"This might be a little long winded but it's about time the podium Robin makes an appearance. It's been a really long time since I felt passionate about making a public comment since the last time I stood at that podium. When I was elected, the most common advice that I received was don't change who you are. It seems the underlying meaning is don't change, unless you don't agree with my view or opinion. So, here I am. In my opinion, the word transparency has become an excuse to bring out personal agendas, public interrogation, humiliation and air dirty laundry. There are items on the agenda tonight that several councilmembers wanted to have removed, the items remain. These items have been addressed by legal and staff. I see no benefit to the city, to city staff and to council by discussing these items tonight in public. But mostly, I see no benefit to my hometown's reputation. When I walked into this chamber, I walked in fighting for Hutto. Now I'm fighting for a better Hutto. But, don't confuse me with the new version of fight for a better Hutto. My vision for a better Hutto is this, we have to drop the us versus them mentality. And, I do believe Scott Rose said that on the dais, that he didn't want to resign because they would be winning. And when I say this I'm talking to both sides. From the podium I did have-- what some would say was my side, the us. When I sat in this seat, I had to drop the us mentality. Now I represent the all, everyone. That is my job. A better Hutto also means better leadership, leadership that does not use Facebook as a battleground, leadership that does not post a personal email from our ex-city manager to his staff and include his personal contact information. If we truly care about what is best for Hutto we would be more concerned about our reputation, more than winning and being right. If we aren't concerned about our city's reputation, how are we going to recruit and retain quality staff and top talent. How do we get big businesses to come and grow with us? How do we build the relationships that we need to help us move forward? It is time to grow up and look at the big picture. Our role as a councilmember is not to get involved with the day-to-day business in the City Hall. Our job is to make the best decisions on behalf of those who call Hutto home and those who will call it home in the future. Our job is to represent Hutto with humility, discernment and gratitude because we are blessed to be sitting in this role. Our job is to improve the quality of life for everyone. A better Hutto reflects unity between all organizations that can make Hutto better and great. If we can set aside our personal agendas and work together to find solutions, everyone wins. If everyone wins, our citizens win and Hutto wins. I guess the real question is do you want to be part of the problem or do you want to be part of the solution. Yes, we have a lot of messes to clean up. We are on that path. We don't have to keep picking at the scab and exposing the wound every chance we

get. And this is where I'm going to get real folks ---comments have been made and communicated about the way female councilmembers are being treated on the dais- - when I am asked what is going on, why is the Mayor talking down to y'all and treating y'all like 5th graders---it calls to question. I don't even know how to respond other than we actually questioned him and stood up to him. Come to find out, I'm not the only one who's been contacted with the same observations. I will no longer tolerate being talked down to, talked over and marginalized. I will no longer tolerate being yelled at and belittled out here or back there. No matter how loud you can yell I'm the mayor doesn't mean you have sovereign power over the rest of us or the city. You are equal. You are a presiding officer. We are not a Mayor-strong city. We, as a body, should be part of the decision making and negotiations on behalf of the city. Mayor, you are a figurehead of the city-- for the city. You hold no more power than I do. We have all heard stories about how awful it was being in the back with the previous ex-C.M., not Warren. The yelling and the screaming, the other councilmembers being privy to information you didn't have. The hypocrisy that is being displayed is ridiculous. The way you have spoke to the women and the things you said in the back to us were inappropriate and unprofessional. The interrogation tactic you took with councilmembers about discussions with our recent ex-C.M. was appalling. I am happy that we are recording executive sessions now. The behavior you exhibited was not the one of the leader. I am saying, on the record, that it needs to stop. It is not a good look for you for the governing body or the city."

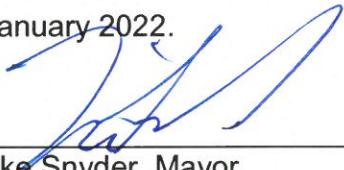

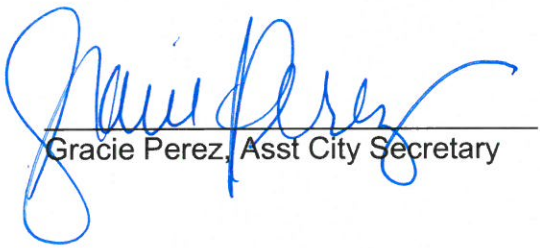
